

## SURPRISE VISIT BY GOOD SAMARITAN NUNS



What a wonderful surprise to receive a visit from two Good Samaritan nuns - Jill McCorquodale and Judy Ryan, last Thursday. During the 1970s they holidayed at St Joseph's Korumburra. In fact, during school holidays, nuns from all around Victoria would swap their place of accommodation to experience somewhere different. At this time, Jill and Judy were teachers and nuns working in State Schools in Reservoir, and they shared very fond memories of their holidays spent at the St Joseph's convent. One of the main reasons for their visit on Thursday, was to take photos of our school to share with a past principal of our St Joseph's, Sr Thecla Ryan, a 100 year old Good Samaritan nun who led our school (and who was probably the Superior of the St Joe's Convent) in the years 1971-1976. Interestingly, Sr Thecla's sister, Sr Mary Ellen Ryan, was also a principal at St Joe's between 1980-1984. The Ryan sisters originated from Coragulac.

Many of you who have spent time in the Staffroom will have seen the beautiful black and white photo of a group of nuns celebrating a Golden Jubilee in the 1960s dressed in their full regalia. Judy and Jill were able to identify many of their fellow sisters from this photo and recall their personalities.

During their time working years, Jill was involved in Motor Missions where she would visit State Schools within Victoria educating the Catholic children in attendance about their faith and preparing them to make their sacraments. She was also involved in writing Religious Education Programs in the '70s. Judy was a past principal of St Patrick's, Port Fairy at the age of 24.

Kathleen from the school office was able to share a crucifix with the ladies that was salvaged during the demolition of the sheds, on the site of the new water tanks. Jill and Judy were able to explain that each nun had their own crucifix like this one which they kept polished, and which hung from a nun's rosary beads that draped from the waist. They were most curious about how it ended up in the shed.

The ladies were most grateful to receive a copy of the book compiled by our very own Nat Kratz celebrating 100 years of Catholic Education in Korumburra.



### SCHOOL GARDEN




